Title: Market Rate Appraisals

Original Sponsor: NAHB's Multifamily Council Board of Trustees

WHEREAS, many Section 8 projects with expiring contracts do not need or do not qualify for mark-to-market;

WHEREAS, if the projects are to be preserved as affordable housing, it is essential that their Section 8 contracts be able to be renewed in a prompt and non-complicated fashion at rents that reflect the market; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that market rent comparisons be performed by a "state certified General Appraiser licensed in the state" in which the project is located;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the National Association of Home Builders urge:

- 1. The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to use the statutory authority it already has to allow rents on expiring Section 8 contracts to be marked up to market.
- 2. HUD to make available the necessary funds on a contract's renewal date and not delay that availability, and
- 3. HUD to rely on the judgment of the independent appraiser as to the projects chosen for rent comparisons, and respect these and other conclusions reached by the independent appraiser.
