

Department of Labor's FY23 Congressionally Directed Spending

In FY23, Congress approved **249 workforce development projects** in the Department of Labor's *Employment and Training Administration's* appropriations bill.

The earmark projects totaled more than **\$217M** for an average award of **\$873K**.
